SOLOSEC[®] is a single dose oral antibiotic that provides a complete course of therapy to treat trichomoniasis (trich)¹

What is SOLOSEC[®]?

SOLOSEC[®] (secnidazole) 2g oral granules is a prescription medicine used to treat Trichomoniasis, a common sexually transmitted infection (STI), in people 12 years of age and older. People taking SOLOSEC[®] for Trichomoniasis should avoid having sex until they and their sex partners are treated with the same dose and at the same time, to prevent reinfection. It is not known if SOLOSEC[®] is safe and effective in children under 12 years of age.

Trich is a common sexually transmitted infection (STI) that can affect both women and men²

Trich is **passed from partner to partner** during sexual intercourse²

Trich is...

The most common nonviral STI in the world 2

Caused by a parasite called Trichomonas vaginalis²

Found in both men and women, although it's more common in women²

Symptoms of trich in women include²:

- Frothy vaginal discharge that's yellowish or greenish
- Vaginal itching and irritation
- An unpleasant odor

Many people with trich (around 70%) do not have any symptoms²

If you have sex—especially unprotected sex—with someone who has trich, you can be infected²

There's no test that can tell you who originally gave you the infection



Since trich can last for months or even years without treatment, a trich diagnosis does not necessarily mean you were recently infected²



Unless you and your partner(s) are all treated at the same time, you are likely to be reinfected if you have sex²





Why do I need to see my healthcare provider (HCP) right away to treat trich?

Leaving trich untreated can have **serious consequences**, so it's important to see your HCP for effective treatment²

Research has shown that untreated or improperly treated trich is associated with increased risk of:

- Developing pelvic inflammatory disease (PID), which can threaten your fertility^{2,3}
- Complications with your pregnancy, including late term miscarriage, premature birth, and low birth weight²
- Developing cervical cancer, which can be life-threatening⁴
- Getting sexually transmitted infections (STIs) like herpes, chlamydia, gonorrhea, and HIV, and transmitting STIs to your partner²
- Complications with gynecological surgery²

You can take action to help reduce the risk of reinfection²

Not completing your full course of treatment is associated with trich that sticks around $^{\rm 5}$

If your partner isn't treated, you're likely to get trich again²

Protect yourself and your partner(s) by getting treatment from your HCP, like **single-dose SOLOSEC**[®]

Many women have trich and BV—another vaginal infection—at the same time⁶

In fact, studies show that around 70% of women with trich are also infected with the bacteria that cause ${\rm BV^6}$



Having BV and trich increases your risk of getting other STIs like herpes, gonorrhea, and chlamydia⁷

With SOLOSEC[®], you and your partner(s) can complete treatment for trich with **just one oral dose** each at the same time¹

SOLOSEC[®] is a **single dose oral** antibiotic that's FDA-approved to treat **trichomoniasis (trich)** in adults¹



- All partners should be treated with the same dose and at the same time to prevent reinfection^{1,2}
- After you're diagnosed with trich, make sure you refrain from sexual intercourse with your partner(s) until everyone is treated and your symptoms go away²
- Let your partner know that SOLOSEC[®] provides a complete course of treatment with one oral dose¹



Ask your HCP if they can provide you with a SOLOSEC prescription for your partner

SOLOSEC

- Keeps working in the body and treating trich for several days after one dose⁸
 - Was shown to be effective in clinical studies
 92.3% of women and 92%-100% of men were cured after treatment with SOLOSEC^{®1,9}

With SOLOSEC[®], you can continue to use your vaginal products (tampons)

Open the packet and sprinkle the entire contents of the packet onto applesauce, yogurt or pudding

Consume all of the mixture within 30 minutes. DO NOT CHEW OR CRUNCH THE GRANULES



You can drink a glass of water after taking SOLOSEC[®] to help with swallowing, if needed. Do not try to dissolve the medication in water or any other liquid

Your sexual partner(s) should be treated at the same time¹

How can I save money on my SOLOSEC[®] prescription?

There are multiple ways to access a co-pay card that may help you save money on your SOLOSEC[®] prescription^{*}



If commercially insured, most eligible patients may pay **as little as \$25** for SOLOSEC[®].* If you don't have insurance or are paying cash, you may still pay as little as \$75

What is SOLOSEC[®]?

SOLOSEC[®] (secnidazole) 2g oral granules is a prescription medicine used to treat bacterial vaginosis in females 12 years of age and older. SOLOSEC[®] is used to treat Trichomoniasis, a common sexually transmitted infection (STI), in people 12 years of age and older. People taking SOLOSEC[®] for Trichomoniasis should avoid having sex until they and their sex partners are treated with the same dose and at the same time, to prevent reinfection. It is not known if SOLOSEC[®] is safe and effective in children under 12 years of age.

How should I take SOLOSEC®?

SOLOSEC® is a single-dose therapy for oral use. Use SOLOSEC® by sprinkling an entire packet of SOLOSEC® onto applesauce, yogurt, or pudding. The entire dose should be taken at once, and finished within 30 minutes. Avoid chewing or crunching the granules. SOLOSEC® should not be taken by dissolving the granules in any liquid. Avoid drinking alcohol during treatment with SOLOSEC® and for 2 days (48 hours) after you take SOLOSEC®.
